Rebuilding Broken Walls:

Lessons from Nehemiah's Faithful Leadership

The annual retreat, held via Zoom on January 13, 2024, was facilitated by Ed and Oyay Jimenez. Here's a summary of Nehemiah's task and the faith lessons his life brings:

Nehemiah, a Jew and cupbearer to King Artaxerxes of Persia, felt burdened upon learning that the walls and city gates of Jerusalem, where his brothers and sisters lived, lay in ruins. He earnestly prayed for God to move the king's heart to allow him to travel to Jerusalem with the goal of leading and motivating the Israelites to rebuild the walls. His request was granted, and he received provisions from the king for his mission.

With conviction, skilled workers joined their resources and used various strategies to rebuild the walls and city gates. Despite opposition and threats, Nehemiah's leadership and his desire to encourage teamwork and trust in God's faithfulness enabled the mission's success. The walls, which had been destroyed for nearly a century and a half, were rebuilt in just 52 days.

Nehemiah's mission, strategies, teamwork, and success highlight four faith lessons:

1. The power of fervent prayer:

Nehemiah's heartfelt prayers, fasting, and pleading for God's blessing and favor pleased God and translated his desires into action.

2. **Trust in God's promises:** Nehemiah found strength in God's enduring covenant and shared God's word with the Israelites, helping them remain confident and focused amidst challenges.

3. Effective persuasion and teamwork:

Nehemiah united the Israelites and inspired them to work together wholeheartedly, resulting in successful rebuilding.

4. **Perseverance:** Nehemiah's steadfast leadership and hard work, along with the dedication of his team, exemplify the importance of perseverance in achieving goals.

As Ed and Oyay concluded their sharing, they encouraged reflection on what we can learn from Nehemiah's relationship with God and how it applies to our lives today. Their insights refreshed and encouraged the REACH family for the challenges of 2024.

January: Understanding the Gospel

Kicking off the year, REACH Cebu welcomed Lito Ouano as the speaker for January's fellowship. Ouano delved into the essence of the Gospel, emphasizing Christ's sacrifice, burial, and resurrection as the core message. Around 30 to 40 youth actively participated, and discovered ways to deepen their understanding of the Gospel and strategizing on how to share it with others.

February: Nurturing Healthy Relationships

Moving into February, REACH Cebu focused on nurturing healthy relationships among the youth. They held a discussion led by Ronald and Dynna Golez on the principles of courtship. With over 50 to 60 attendees, questions poured in during the Question and Answer session, addressing concerns about relationships with non-Christians, managing emotions, and handling emotional blackmail.

The month concluded with a heartfelt pledge of purity, symbolized by the distribution of white handkerchiefs, signifying the commitment of the youth to uphold purity and honor the sanctity of marriage.







Additionally, on the last week of February, they held an intimate workshop on biblical principles of marriage, facilitated once again by Ronald and Dynna. Couples from Heaven Harvest Church gathered to explore common marital challenges and effective solutions, emphasizing the importance of God at the center of marriage and the principles of unity, leaving, cleaving, and commitment.
